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

 Providence ElderPlace operates 9 sites in Oregon & 5 sites in Washington





ElderPlace PACE members (participants) receive their care in a PACE Health & Social Center or in their home


Health Center = Medical clinic

Social Center = Senior center with care givers

Typical PACE seniors:

- Medicaid Long Term Services eligible
- Have multiple complex chronic conditions
- Need more support in their home/assisted living
- High ER utilizers
- Dementia diagnosis
- Mental health diagnosis

Why is PACE so successful?

- Early intervention & prevention
- 24 PCP visits per year (on average)*
- 93% see their RN monthly*
- 4 Social work visit per month*
- Community Care RN visits



Medicaid services

• States pay PACE programs on average 13 percent less than the cost of caring for a comparable population through other Medicaid services, including nursing homes and home and community-based waiver programs.¹

• In Medicare, payments to PACE organizations are equivalent to the predicted costs for a comparable population to receive services through the fee-for-service program."

PACE Provides High Quality Outcomes

• Reduced Hospital Admissions: A 24 percent lower hospitalization rate than dually-eligible beneficiaries who receive Medicaid nursing home services.^{iv}

• Decreased Rehospitalizations: 16 percent less than the national rehospitalization rate of 22.9 percent for dually-eligible beneficiaries age 65 and over.^v


• Reduced ER Visits: Less than one emergency room visit per member per year.^{vi,vii}
